Dear Brothers & Sisters,

It is with great pleasure and pride that I report our Union Hall and Offices are now owned “free and clear”. Our remaining mortgage balance of over \$2 million has been paid in full! Our funds continue to increase and flourish! With the exception of our operating expenses and monthly maintenance costs, Local 73 is debt free! We have worked tirelessly and have had the determination to deliver stability while being steadfast in our business decisions to Move Our Union Forward. Together we have had many positive accomplishments! We can, and should both acknowledge and celebrate them!

At this time, the work situation is good but it could always be better. We are continually striving to have full employment for our members. The seasons are changing and unfortunately that sometimes also brings a slowdown to our work. Preparing for the winter slowdown is difficult and never welcome. We need to have as much outside work completed to allow for the tenant work to carry us into and through the cold weather. Another apprentice sign-up is in progress and that's always a welcome sign of an increase of our upcoming work.

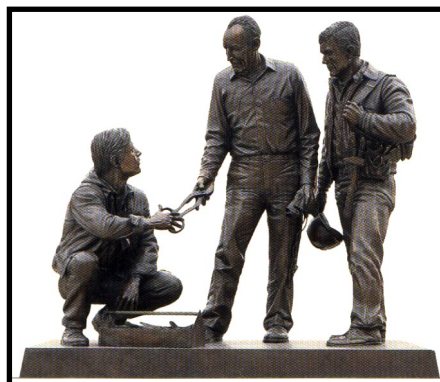
In early October, I will be traveling to China, representing Local 73, for instruction and training of production, in preparation and development of our upcoming Rail Car assembly jobs. This endeavor will be a joint venture with SMW Local 73 and IBEW Local 134 to employ many of our members with the Chinese company, CRRC. At the present time, the assembly plant where the Rail Cars will be produced is under construction with a PLA in place to protect our labor movement. As more information becomes available on future Rail Car assembly jobs, I will pass it on to you.

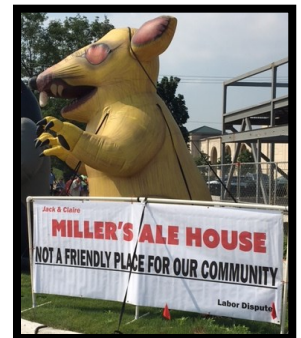
UNION SHEET METAL WORKERS DON'T RUN ON DUNKIN'!
